- **Dr. Kirsten Limesand** has been named the Vice Provost for Graduate Education and Dean of the Graduate College and began her new role on Jan. 9. Thank you to Carmie Garzione and the search committee for their work.
- The <u>Provost's Investment Fund</u> has \$1 million available for the spring cycle and is <u>accepting proposals</u> through Feb. 23. A <u>proposal workshop</u> will be offered at 1 p.m. on Feb. 2.
- The University of Arizona hosted a site visit by the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) on campus on Jan. 18-20 in connection with its application for accreditation. Open meetings to seek input from faculty, staff and students were held on Jan. 18 from 4:45-5:30 p.m. at the Student Union Memorial Center. The reviewers have commended us for 6 aspects of our operations (General Education refresh, research infrastructure improvements, data and analytics and assessment, living strategic plan and aligned budget, support for student academic success/retention/undergraduate research/engagement and outreach to community), and have recommendations for improvements spanning 5 aspects of our operations (program learning outcomes / assessments / continuous improvement, develop and implement a strategic plan for inclusion, shared governance processes, use of digital platforms for urgent communications, tracking of student complaints).
- Gail Burd and Jane Hunter invite Faculty Senators to participate in one of the UA-UAGC Coordination Work Groups. The Work Groups are reviewing what should be done during the stabilization phase (~3-6 months) and the optimization phase.
