ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

At the Committee's March 15 meeting, it discussed the Pay One Price course material program, expenses for Pom Squad members, students missing classes before Thanksgiving due to travel, classroom first-aid supplies, and the student emergency fund status.

We also addressed a range of issues put forward by a faculty member in the School of Middle Eastern & North African Studies. The letter said students were concerned about the Writing Center, campus security, mandatory student fees, dorm maintenance and lack of toilet paper on weekends, availability of water refill stations on campus, and difficulty making appointments with Student Health Services. The committee is collecting information and will share back what it learns.

On March 16, SAPC members participated in the "Technology Access: A Basic Student Need" session at UArizona's <u>Diversity & Inclusion Symposium</u>.

Our next SAPC meeting is April 12. We are trying to invite a representative of the Meal Plans Office to share details about the <u>new mandatory meal plan</u> for all first-year students living on campus (starting in Fall 2023). We have questions about costs, options, waivers, and other issues.

The committee also would like to make Senate aware of the following student- and course-related news and resources:

- If faculty haven't submitted Fall 2023 <u>textbook adoptions</u> to the UA BookStores yet, please do so as soon as possible. In order to have Fall 2023 course materials included in Pay One Price (the flat-rate course materials program launching for all undergraduate students in Fall 2023), timely textbook adoptions are essential. Please see the <u>frequently asked questions for faculty</u> or email <u>payoneprice@arizona.edu</u> for more information about Pay One Price.
- The <u>Writing Skills Improvement Program</u> offers free services for undergraduate and graduate students during the semester, including:
 - **Individual appointments**: meet with a writing specialist for 50 minutes to review and discuss documents, strategies, concerns, etc.
 - **Drop-in sessions**: meet with a writing specialist for 20 minutes to review short documents or discuss quick questions
 - **Online Writing Room**: join our Wednesday room for facilitated writing time. A specialist is on-hand to meet for quick discussions. The room is open all year, 12-2 pm (AZ)
 - Writing Workshops: Alternating Monday and Wednesday workshops
 - **Small Group appointments**: meet with a writing specialist and group of 3-4 other writers for facilitated feedback
