- We procured 100% renewable energy from the grid for the Tucson campus and are leading the Action Plan process








What Is An Action Plan, and Why Is It Helpful?

- The Action Plan will be a living planning tool
 that provides a strategic framework for
 adaptation and mitigation actions around
 climate and sustainability
- The Action Plan will build resilience, reduce exposure to risk and costs, attract and retain students, staff, and faculty, and strengthen community partnerships





Where Do We Stand?

- Each one of our ABOR-defined peers, as well as Arizona State University and Northern Arizona University, has an Action Plan
- We lag approximately 10 years behind in creating a formal Action Plan
- Despite pandemic-driven emissions reductions, we are on track to see a return to "business as usual" in most areas







Business As Usual Is Not An Option

 The recently released report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change concludes that we face a "rapidly closing window of opportunity to secure a livable and sustainable future for all"










Tucson Campus Greenhouse Gases By Fiscal Year


