Brief Description:

The *Department of Otolaryngology* will work with the College of Medicine – Phoenix in meeting the College's commitment to improve health and healthcare for our diverse Arizona community. This Department will partner with Banner Health to deliver patient care and medical training.

The department will be integral to training our students and U of A sponsored medical residents. The department will also serve the faculty to provide support related to their teaching and mentorship, recruitment and retention, research activities, faculty appointments and promotion efforts in alignment with the College's strategic goals.

Reason for Establishing the Organizational Unit:

The *Department of Otolaryngology* will be located at the University of Arizona College of Medicine – Phoenix and it will support the activities of current and future programs related to ear, nose, throat, oral/maxillofacial surgical programs.

The decision to create this department was both strategic and necessary. Strategically, it is designed to support the educational and clinical mission of the College and Health Sciences. The program will reside within the College and house both board certified physician faculty members and a new otolaryngology residency program. It is also strategically related to ongoing medical/physician workforce challenges in Arizona that limit access to health care for our community.

Resources:

Start-up funding for the department includes a combination of Banner – University Medicine Mission support funding and other University unrestricted funds. Budgeted expenditures include faculty and staff, medical residency program, operations, travel, continuing education, capital equipment, educational software, costs for clinical rotations and fees for accreditation and society memberships. Revenues and expenditures increase annually, from FY2024 through FY2027 as the unit becomes fully established.

The College is expected to generate future funding streams from research activity, philanthropy and new educational programs, but those revenues and associated expenses are not included in the initial budget.



Shared support services, including marketing and communications, finance and accounting, human resources, information and educational technology management, research administration and philanthropy are provided through the College of Medicine - Phoenix and Office of the Senior Vice President for Health Sciences. Memorandum of Understanding to affect service level agreements and the expense assigned to the College will be developed for each administrative function.

Space will be allocated for administrative and research endeavors at the BSPB on the PBC campus and at Banner - University Medical Center Phoenix.

To Whom it May Concern,

In my role as Chairman of the Department of Surgery at University of Arizona College of Medicine-Phoenix, the subspeciality of ENT is currently established as a division within the Department of Surgery. There is now a shortage of ENT practitioners in the Phoenix valley and specifically within the Banner system. As a result, there is a desire at the University and at Banner to employ academic ENT surgeons and to ultimately start a residency training program in this specialty. While it might seem that removing the division from the department would be disadvantageous, it is what is best for the college, as nationally and at UACOM-T it is a separate department.

I have chaired the search committee to recruit a Division Chief of ENT on two occasions over the past 3 years. In the first effort, our finalist withdrew at the 11th hour as he was offered the Chair of the Department of ENT at Emory University. In the second effort, the finalist withdrew late in the recruitment process approximately 6 months ago. This was due in part to personal reasons, but he made it clear that the AAMC salary benchmark for division chief was a low figure.

At most academic institutions, ENT is an individual department separate from the Department of Surgery. Departmental status confers prestige and chair salaries exceed those of division chiefs. I strongly believe that the Division of ENT within the Department of Surgery at UACOM-P should be elevated to departmental status. This would make the Chair position more attractive to high-caliber applicants. I truly believe that elevating ENT to a department here would markedly increase the possibility of attracting a distinguished leader, developing a strong academic program, and, ultimately, establishing a residency training program. Consolidating ENT services at BUMCP would also immediately enhance the opportunities for our students to have mentorship and rotations in otolaryngology, which are now lacking.

To whom it may concern,

I am happy to write this letter of strong and enthusiastic support for this application to make the division of otolaryngology into a formal department at the University of Arizona College of Medicine Phoenix. Formation of this department is an important part of our growth as an academic medical center, is being done with a close collaboration at Banner health and will enhance our mission as a premier training site for our students and residents.

For context, nationally, it is most common for otolaryngology to be its own department and not a division within a department of surgery. Having otolaryngology as a division has been identified as a reason that we have not been able to recruit leaders and faculty into this specialty area. In 2015 the college of medicine Tucson elevated the division of otolaryngology to a department to be more aligned with national norms and to attract high quality faculty and trainees.

The reason for this request is many fold. First and foremost, otolaryngology is an important department for educating medical students residents and fellows. Secondly, our affiliation with Banner Health is important to the health of our communities and medical school. Strategically, Banner Health in Phoenix has identified otolaryngology as a priority to help our patients get the health care they need. As such, this department is collaboratively funded with Banner through The Banner University Medicine division. Finally, this department will elevate research through clinical trials, basic science scholarship, and training the next generation.

Having an otolaryngology department is a must for any contemporary, top tier College of Medicine and Academic Medical Center. Both the College and Banner have recognized there is an unmet need in our community and that the region will benefit from a robust otolaryngology department.

The creation of this department has my full support, I'm excited to see this happen, and will help ensure the success of this department.
