

## **President's Updates**

December 1, 2025, Faculty Senate

- The **November meeting of the Arizona Board of Regents** included our presentation, <u>Reporting on Our Promise</u>, highlighting the hard work and success of many throughout the university to implement the vision of our strategic imperatives. Thank you to the senators and faculty officers who joined us.
- On November 25, we announced the University of Arizona will maintain the same tuition rate for
  undergraduate resident students for the third year in a row, with modest increases for other student
  groups. This plan prioritizes affordability in line with our focus on student success and the land-grant
  mission.
- The **FY 2027 All Funds budget planning process** begins soon. This process will provide the opportunity for discussion of operational strategies, forecasted risks, and new resource requests and needs.
- The Campus Master Plan process is being restarted with our consultant, Ayers Saint Gross, with a target
  completion date of spring 2026. The Master Plan will include a critical analysis of facilities, real estate,
  mobility, open space, and overall campus experience. The inclusive process will engage a wide variety of
  stakeholders. For more information, visit the project website.
- The Office of Research and Partnerships has initiated two pilot programs with Banner Health to expedite
  time-to-activation of clinical trials. The office also has awarded six new Bridge Funding grants a full list of
  recipients is available on the ORP website.
- ORP has launched the Convergence Awards: Excellence in Research and Creative Activity, a new university-wide program recognizing faculty for outstanding scholarly achievement, innovation and societal impact; nominations will be accepted through Feb. 4, 2026, with the inaugural ceremony in mid-April.
- I have continued **meetings and tours with colleges and centers**, including the College of Agriculture, Life & Environmental Sciences; College of Architecture, Planning and Landscape Architecture; Eller College of Management; College of Nursing; and James E. Rogers College of Law.
- Senator Ruben Gallego and members of his staff <u>visited campus</u> to discuss our strategic initiatives and key
  priorities for the university. They also toured the Skin Cancer Institute at the University of Arizona Cancer
  Center.
- Arizona Athletics submitted its Academic Progress Rate (APR) data to the NCAA on October 20, with
  official publication expected in May 2026. Currently, thirty-five student-athletes are on track to earn their
  degrees following the successful completion of fall courses.
- In competitive success, **Women's Triathlon** captured its second straight national championship, led by individual champion Kelly Wetteland and Coach of the Year honoree Wes Johnson. **Arizona Football** earned bowl eligibility with its sixth win on November 8, reaching a record of 9-3 after a win in the Territorial Cup on November 28, and **Men's Basketball** is ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the nation.
