III. Purpose and Activities of the Unit

Africana Studies is not a new unit, but we recently learned that it had evidently not been reported to ABOR when it was established in the 1980s. It houses tenured, tenure-track, and career-track faculty who teach courses and conduct research and public service in African, African diaspora, African American studies, and Hip-Hop studies.

B Describe the activities, projects, and programs that will be conducted by the new unit.

The unit offers an interdisciplinary major (BA in Africana Studies), two minors (Africana Studies & Hip Hop Cultures), and various internships and study abroad opportunities. Particularly notable is its use of new technologies and its leadership in online offerings and digital humanities.

C. Describe demonstrable partnerships and partnership support that arise from the creation of the unit.

Africana Studies has become a hub for diversity, multiculturalism and collaborative teaching and research efforts. Courses are cross-listed with a wide variety of other units (Anthropology, English, French, Gender and Women's Studies, Geography, Honors, Latin American Studies, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology, Religious Studies, and Theater

Arts). Collaborations with non-academic programs and centers on campus are growing, and currently include the Center for Digital Humanities, the Poetry Center and Faculty Fellows.

D. How does formal creation of this unit directly promote the fostering of collaborative and synergistic research and outreach beyond what is already happening on campus with existing entities?

E. Alignment of the proposed unit's purpose to the reporting unit and the University's strategic goals.

Africana Studies supports the University's strategic plan by preparing students with the skills and mindsets to lead in the 4th Industrial Revolution, by supporting and strengthening the University's commitment to equity and diverse communities, and by contributing to research on both global and local topics related to Africa and the African diaspora.

F. Documented support from affiliated faculty, department heads, and deans. At the college level, alignment of the proposed unit's goals and objectives to the college's recruitment plan and programmatic priorities.

Following the most recent Academic Program Review's recommendation in Fall 2020, and with the encouragement of Provost Liesl Folks and Dean A-P Durand, in Spring 2021 the Africana Studies faculty voted unanimously in favor of officially changing their name from Africana Studies Program to Department of Africana Studies. In pursuing that goal, we learned that ABOR had no record of the unit. The College strongly supports regularizing the existence of Africana Studies.

Africana Studies undergoes Academic Program Reviews every seven years. The most recent review was in Fall 2020. The criteria are the same as for all of our academic units, which must demonstrate excellence in teaching, research and outreach, as demonstrated in the unit's self-study and evaluated by an external review committee.
