ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

The committee met on 4/13/22 and discussed the process and status of CARE reports submitted to the Dean of Students Office, the recent <u>ABOR-approved increase in tuition and fees</u>, the mandatory meal plan included in the student service fee increase for Fall 2023, and issues for UAGC students under the GI Bill.

The committee would like to make Senate aware of the following student-focused news and resources:

- Counseling & Psych Services (CAPS) have partnered with <u>Togetherall</u>, a company providing virtual peer-to-peer mental health and wellbeing support that is moderated by clinical mental health professionals. Resources are free for students and are available 24/7/365. For more information, see <u>https://caps.arizona.edu/togetherall</u>.
- As the academic year comes to a close, students experience increased need. Please share UArizona's <u>Basic Needs website</u> widely with your students!
- After being piloted in the Honors College this semester, the student information hub <u>CatCloud</u> is due to be rolled out more widely to undergraduate students in the fall. CatCloud enables students to view their grades, upcoming assignments and events, and CatCash balances, and to schedule appointments with advisers and other student support units. Additional functionality is being developed.

- Explore and assess instructional and other student-facing policies (pre/post pandemic effects)
